# May Is Mental Health Awareness Month -Project SUN Is Here to Help Families Find Answers!

Why is mental health awareness so important? The American Academy of Pediatrics estimates that **1 in 5, or 20%**, of America's children will be affected by a mental health disorder (2019). When applied to estimates for Kankakee County, that figure indicates around 5,000 children in our community are in need of mental health services.

How can Project SUN help? Project SUN can assist Kankakee County families with children under the age of 21 in navigating their mental health journey. Call Project SUN's office at 815-304-5933 if you would like help:

- Discovering next steps if your child is struggling with their emotions, behaviors, or if
  a screening has indicated a potential mental health concern.
- Connecting with other parents who have gone through the process of accessing behavioral health care for their child.
- Learning more about children's behavioral health and relevant child and family wellness topics.
