Plans were made and implemented, and new events were created. This year we witnessed the second round of our My Piece in the Puzzle initiative, hosted a very successful Youth Mental Health and Wellness Fest at the Kankakee Farmers' Market, and participated in a greater number of community events.

We continued our efforts to establish a parent advisory group and a mental health workforce development group, as well as to provide support to the LGBTQ+ youth in our community. Our craft classes remained constant, with more families joining in for fun nights of relaxation and creativity. We displayed billboards around the county and continued to work hard to provide families in our community with the help needed.

2022 marks the halfway point of our mission. Although there is still so much more to do, we want to celebrate with you. November 19 Open House Recap

To kickstart our *Just for the Fun of It* campaign, we hosted an eventful day at the Exploration Station... a children's museum. On early Saturday morning, November 19, the museum opened its doors to over 100 families to enjoy free play time at the museum and experience activities that are part of our Play to Connect program. Families were invited to explore each one of the Play to Connect stations at the museum, including the newest addition, "The Feelings Room." Our friends from the Birth to Five Initiative and the Life Education Center, including Harold, the giraffe, joined in welcoming our guests.

Created out of a partnership between Project SUN and the Exploration Station...a children's museum, the Feelings Room displays various activities intended to help children explore their emotions and feelings. Volunteers encouraged parents and their children to participate in some Theraplay-based activities and Sunshine Circle groups during the event to practice intentional play activities that they can do at home. The activities were many, and the fun was endless.





Progress on NAMI Kankakee

Three individuals have been trained as Family Support Group Facilitators! This is just the beginning. We hope to send many more to the next scheduled training, as well as individuals living with mental illness who are interested in facilitating Connection Support Groups. This fall, we submitted our Affiliate Application to NAMI IL. We are officially on our way! As we continue to recruit and train volunteers, we aim to begin support groups in early 2023. Interest is growing, particularly in Kankakee, Bourbonnais, and Pembroke. We'll also look to establish a NAMI Kankakee Board of Directors. This will be crucial to ensuring a lasting NAMI presence for years to come.

To round out the year, two of our support group facilitators and a member of our planning team attended the annual NAMI IL conference in Palos Hills, IL. They attended workshops on Peer Mentoring, 988 Crisis Response, and the value of a Mental Health Board for communities. Much of what they learned is being discussed in by the Project SUN Executive Team and in our workgroups as part of our future planning.
