With the primary focus on youth engagement and family support, the exhibit's goal is to improve the social and emotional development of the children that visit. Staff will monitor this exhibit for qualities such as playability, family engagement, and the number of children playing in it daily.

# Successful Fall Gathering hosted by Project SUN with local Mental Health professionals.

In efforts to establish a children's mental health network in Kankakee County, Project SUN met with approximately 25 local licensed therapists and school social workers in September. This allowed Project SUN to share partnership opportunities with those attending.

Individuals were encouraged to accept the invitation to be active members of the children's behavioral health system of care. Opportunities to collaborate focused on making and accepting referrals, expanding services by offering group sessions, and developing various workforce development strategies. A Mental Health Workforce Development Workgroup was formed to develop policies and procedures to facilitate these efforts. Specifically, they will address how to meet the mental health needs of families and youth, such as anger management, coping skills, anxiety, and depression.



These partnerships will launch a new era for mental health care in Kankakee County. While there is still work to be done, this initial step will soon result in new paid opportunities for local licensed therapists, school social workers, and others providing mental health services to children, adolescents, and their families.

## Project SUN to launch "Just for the fun of it!" campaign in November!

We know that positive relationships with caring adults foster the development of crucial social and emotional skills, often preventing mental, emotional, and

behavioral problems from occurring throughout a child's life. That's why we are launching a campaign called "Just for the fun of it!" The purpose is to encourage parents to play with their children - in intentional ways. Project SUN is part of a local coalition promoting use of Theraplay® inspired practices that help to build healthy, trusting relationships between children and their parents, teachers, and other caregivers.



This campaign will encourage the use of Theraplay strategies to build healthy parent/teacher/caregiver relationships with children.

According to The Theraplay Institute (2022), Theraplay is a dyadic child and family therapy recognized by the Association of Play Therapy as one of seven seminal psychotherapies for children. Practiced around the world, this type of therapy allows for stronger bonds between the child and important adults in their life. As part of the "Just for the Fun of It!" campaign, we will be hosting and promoting various activities for parents and caregivers in our community. Learn about some of them below:

- Parents/Caregivers & Children Interaction Workshop @ Little Me Studio: There will be a four-week pilot program for parents/caregivers and their children in collaboration with Little Me Studio. Participants will be learning new methods and fun activities to teach their children healthy communication skills as they engage in art projects. This program is scheduled to start at the end of October and will be limited to eight caregivers and their children between the ages of 2-12. - **Theraplay Training:** On November 3 and 4, Project SUN and I-KAN ROE will host a two-day Theraplay training for those working with children in group settings, such as classrooms, daycare, residential settings, or with family groups. In addition to seeing the new exhibit, visitors will see demonstrations and be provided with kits for implementing intentional play practices at home. Parents will also hear about opportunities to learn more about Theraplay and simple, playful activities that can help to reduce stress and improve communication within their families. - 1. Serve as a Peer Mentor to other caregivers who need help accessing services or advocating for their child.
- 2. Develop and implement parent engagement activities such as the Parent Café. Select topics of interest and help plan events where parents can learn more about mental health issues.
- 3. Drive the re-establishment of a NAMI chapter in Kankakee County. NAMI, the National Alliance on Mental Illness, is a 100% peer-led organization that offers mental health education and support groups. Join the team that is designing what NAMI Kankakee will offer to our community.
- 4. Participate in Project SUN's Community Planning Team meetings. Many of our county's service providers collaborate with parents to innovate solutions to barriers families face. This is a great space for parents to work with the providers who serve their children to build a better system of care.
- 5. Volunteer to represent Project SUN at outreach events in the community. Your voice and connection with other parents and caregivers are vital to Project SUN's mission to empower families!
